
Matsqui Prairie



Matsqui Prairie lies north of Abbotsford Centre along the Fraser River. Located in the centre of Matsqui Prairie is Matsqui Village, a historic rural centre. The village is surrounded by agricultural land - over 95% of the land is used in agricultural production.

Landmarks include the Chapel on Riverside Road, Matsqui Hall, and Matsqui Trail Regional Park, which provides walking and cycling trails along the Fraser River dyke.

The dominant age group for Matsqui Prairie residents is 10 to 19 years. More than 85% of all residents live in single-detached houses. Almost 40% of all residents have some sort of postsecondary education.


Population





Education & Labour









* Percent of total immigrant population







Households

Families




The majority of families in Matsqui Prairie are two-parent with children at home. Of those families with children living at home, 6 to 14 years is the dominant age group.

Children at Home¹




Dwellings

Almost 40% of all residential dwellings in Matsqui Prairie were constructed in 1960 or before. The dominant dwelling type is single-detached houses, and almost 70% of all dwellings are owned. Almost 10% of dwellings require major repairs.



Housing Types¹









Farm Size⁴




