
Sumas Prairie



Sumas Prairie is a mix of agricultural and commercial areas located to the south of Highway 1. It borders Chilliwack to the east, and the United States to the south. It includes the farming community of Arnold, and the lower portion of Vedder Mountain which separates the prairie from Cultus Lake in Chilliwack.

Landmarks include the Yellow Barn Country Produce, the Powerhouse, and the Bakerview EcoDairy. Walking trails include the Arnold Dyke Trail.

The dominant age group of Sumas Prairie residents is 10 to 19 years. Almost 70% of dwellings are owned.




The dominant age group for Sumas Prairie is 10 to 19 years. There are slightly more men than women. By 2035, the population is estimated to reach 3,500.





Education² (15 years & over)*











Households


The majority of families in Sumas Prairie are two-parent with children at home. Of those families with children living at home, 6 to 14 years is the dominant age group.

Children at Home¹





Dwellings

More than a quarter of all residential dwellings in Sumas Prairie were constructed between 1961 and 1980, and approximately 2% of all dwellings require major repairs. The dominant dwelling type is single-detached houses, and over two thirds of all dwellings are owned.



Housing Types¹





Maintenance Required^{2*}






