
To achieve this vision, Council created four Cornerstones to support and focus the work of Council and the City:

2015 Highlights

- In 2015, Council endorsed the new 2015-2018 Strategic Plan, establishing an exciting vision for the City and providing direction and guidance as our City develops.
- Made further headway on the goals of our **Homelessness Action Plan** by hiring a Homelessness Coordinator, approving the development of a **30 bed** low-barrier shelter and opening a 40 bed temporary winter shelter through local partnerships.
- Development activity saw an increase of 60% in total construction value over 2014; an increase of 22% in land development applications received; and an increase of 27% in new commercial floor space from 2014.
- Initiated the **U-District Neighbourhood** Plan.
- Launched a new program and website for the City **Economic Development** department.
- Won an **Open for Business Award** from the BC Small Business Roundtable. Maintained high quality water service to the community throughout the drought conditions in summer 2015.
- Constructed the new Matsqui Recreation Centre Turf Fields, which adds 64 hours per week of community field time.
- Became the first community in BC to introduce a GIS site selector online that offers property search, demographic analysis and interactive mapping.
- Introduced **e-Billing** for tax and utility bills.



Fiscal Discipline at City Hall

Over the last four years, the City of Abbotsford's annual tax increase has averaged less than 1% per year.

This illustration gives a snapshot of how your money is divided up to support services and amenities across our community.

Sewer and water charges are billed bi-monthly directly to residents that use these services and are not billed on the annual tax notice.

Dollars are based on 2016 budgeted municipal taxes (city/police/library) for a typical single family residence with a property assessment of \$406.000. (Does not include taxes for schools, hospital and the FVRD)
