# 2017 REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY







I am pleased to present this community report highlighting our key accomplishments at the City of Abbotsford for 2017.

As we enter the fourth year of this Council's mandate, many people are starting to ask me to remark on what I am most proud of as Mayor. Although there are many highlights I could mention, probably what is most important to me is the solid, unified direction that Council and staff are striving towards.

This direction is based on Council's 2015-2018 Strategic Plan, envisioning Abbotsford as the Hub of the Fraser Valley. Every decision we make — at the Council level and by our staff — is guided by the four cornerstones of this Plan: vibrant economy. complete community, fiscal discipline and organizational alignment. Sometimes as a Council, we may have healthy debates about the best way to achieve these goals, but we are all driving towards the same end goal.

The following report reflects the progress we are making in realizing Council's Strategic Plan. We have made significant headway over the past three years, but there is still more to be accomplished beyond what we have done so far.

Last year, the City launched our Plan200K project, a comprehensive planning process that includes the updating of 20 different Master Plans, Neighbourhood Plans, Studies and Projects, that will help to guide the City as we grow to a community of 200,000 residents. Within

this year, we will see the completion of the plans in the Plan200K project, leaving us in great shape to approach our future.

It's very exciting for me to see our vision progressing. Part of that excitement is sparked by the fact that our plans are the collaborative work of City staff in consultation with you, our businesses and residents. Through online surveys, open houses and public events, you are all continuing to help to shape these important directions.

Building the hub is definitely a community effort. As a Council, we thank you, our residents and businesses, for caring about our city and for being willing to share your dreams and ideas for how our community should continue to grow.

Abbotsford is a vibrant, diverse city on the move with an exciting future. As your City Council, we thank you for allowing us the privilege to serve you in one of the best cities in BC.

### 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- Launched our Plan200K project, initiating the update of 20 Master Plans, Strategies and Studies to align with the City's Official Community Plan
- Received \$30 million in federal, provincial and local funding toward the **Vye Road** widening and Highway 11 overpass projects which will improve access to the Canada-US border crossing as well as YXX.
- Launched a new City Services App, @Abbotsford, which allows residents to stay connected with the City and report issues directly through their smart device.
- Received an Excellence in Policy Planning GOLD Award from the Planning Institute of BC and a 2017 Canadian Institute of Planners Award for **Planning Excellence** for the Abbotsforward Official Community Plan project.
- Attended more than 9,000 fire rescue emergency response incidents in 2017, which is an increase of 49% over 5 years.
- Announced the Salton Road Pedestrian/Cycling Bridge that will improve mobility and safety for pedestrians and cyclists and enhance our active transportation systems.

Implemented new mobile technologies for Bylaw and Fire Rescue Services to streamline work procedures in the field.

Implemented an internal emergency notification system "Abbotsford Alerts," ensuring that staff are communicated with in the event of an emergency.

Hosted 160 outdoor community events
with an estimated total attendance of 505,075.

The total economic impact of City events was over \$17 million.

Adopted a new Building Bylaw, and streamlined the building permit process with better forms and checklists to provide better customer service and decreased wait times.

grant from FCM and
\$12,000 grant from
the FVRD for our
Municipal Green Fleet
Management Plan,
moving us towards a
greener transportation
infrastructure and
reducing our GHG
emissions.

Launched our Quality
of Life program to
help understand what
factors contribute to
citizens' overall quality
of life to assist with the
development of new
programs, services
and amenities.

Earned a Certificate
of Recognition (COR)
for workplace safety.

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Received **\$200K** in provincial/federal funding for geotechnical (seismic) assessment to the dykes.

Implemented a crosswalk and stop bar marking program, which will see 560 locations marked, 140 annually, to increase safety in the community.

documents into the new electronic document file management system, CEDAR, bringing greater ease to filing and finding documents and collaborating on drafting documents, creating a more productive and efficient work environment.

Educated residents about water conservation at 130 events, including schools and other public events.

Welcomed **44 film productions** to the City, breaking last year's record.



Planned and hosted multiple successful Canada150 community events including the Roving Canada150 Exhibit, Canada Day, and Red White and You initiatives in celebration of Canada's 150th birthday.



Reviewed, accepted and inspected over 600 Telus fiber optic cabinet and underground service locations as part of "fiber to the premises" FTTP network expansion.



Created 'The Case for Prevention' in response to the opioid crisis. From this, a resolution was passed at UBCM to encourage the province to develop a comprehensive program for drug prevention and early intervention.

Saved approximately 605,000 Kwh of annual electricity consumption as part of our 2017 municipal building energy projects.

Responded to over 4,300 calls for Bylaw Service which provided many opportunities to educate residents and businesses on City bylaws.



Conducted 441

Development Inquiry

Meetings, allowing for better collaboration and efficiencies between developers and the City.



Maintained 192 parks in the community, covering 841.5 hectares supporting sport, play and recreation for the community.

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Implemented new remote call-out process for Fire Rescue Services for their paid on-call in-vehicle communications, and improved functionality at a reduced cost.



Opened Shadbolt
Park as well as a new fire fighter themed playground at Exhibition park, in partnership with the Firefighters Association.
