Drone 'No Fly Zone' Within 9km of Airport

ABBOTSFORD, February 3, 2016 – The Abbotsford International Airport and Abbotsford City Council would like to remind the public that, as Unmanned Air Vehicles (UAV) and drones increase in popularity, it is important for operators to be aware of the regulations and 'no fly zones' prior to taking flight.

Transport Canada regulates UAV's and drone use in all communities across the country with the objective of keeping the public and our airspace safe. Before anyone in Abbotsford undertakes the flying of any UAV or drone, it is important to ensure they understand the rules that apply and follow them.

According to Transport Canada, UAV operators need to be at least 9km away from any airport, heliport or aerodrome. The attached map provides an aerial map of the 9km radius around the Abbotsford International Airport.
