The Canada150 Roving Exhibit tells nine historic community stories, including the Abbotsford Lumber Company and Mill Lake, Gur Sikh Temple, Trethewey House, Clayburn Village, First Nations, Great Northern Railway, Mennonite Heritage, South Poplar Schoolhouse and the Abbotsford International Airport.
