Prevention Assessment Referral Clinic (PARC)

The PARC drop-in centre with combined medical services has been providing care since 2010 in Abbotsford

Services provided include

Onsite supervised consumption (ODP), daily food security, community shower and laundry facilities, assessment and referrals for medical and social support needs, access to an on-site medical care team, harm reduction supplies, safer sex education and peer one-one support

Injectable Opioid Agonist Treatment (IOAT)

The purpose of this program is to:

- Actively support clients who use opioids in receiving alternative medications such as injectable hydromorphone or fentanyl patches in a healthcare setting with the support of nurses and harm reduction workers
- Decrease illicit drug use and provide a safer alternative to street substances when OAT may not have been effective in the past
- Provide access to evidence-based harm reduction services
- Provide connections to other community resources
- Create a sense of community

We are currently looking for an additional doctor to join the team

Criteria:

19 years or older

Well-established history of injection drug use with opioids and severe opioid use disorder

Current opioid injection drug use confirmed by patient report, and documented opioid-positive urine drug tests

Able to attend clinic up multiple times a week and self-administer (i.e. inject via intravenous/intramuscular route) medication under supervision if prescribed

Ability to consent to and fully understand the goals of treatment

Unsuccessful past experience with prescribed oral agonist therapies such as Methadone, Suboxone, or slow-release oral Morphine with evidence of regular and ongoing injection opioid use

Mobile HR

Mobile Harm Reduction provides support to those living in the community who may use substances or know someone who does. This program can support those who require additional outreach and support where they are at.

This program allows staff to support individuals who may be living in encampments or other vulnerable situations access medical care as needed, housing resources when available, and provided items such as clean Harm reduction supplies, safer sex supplies, clean drinking water and weather permitted clothing items when available

Anonymous Hotline

Phoenix Society provides an anonymous Harm Reduction delivery service and sharps (needle) pick up

Members in the community can anonymously request harm reduction supplies by simply calling the Hotline.

Items requested may include:

syringes, cookers, ties, alcohol swabs, crack kits, glass bubble pipes (while supplies last) Fentanyl test strips, naloxone and/or training, safer sex supplies, steroid supplies, information pamphlets, or telephone support with out having to disclose their personal information.

Pick up or drop locations can be discussed and non-disclosed packaging can be provided
