The Abbotsford Fireworks Bylaw Bylaw #143-2005 prohibits the sale, possession and discharge of fireworks within the City's borders.

Fire Rescue Service personnel and Bylaw Enforcement Officers will be out actively enforcing the bylaw. Residents caught with fireworks will be subject to fines ranging from \$200 - \$1000 and their fireworks will be confiscated.

Residents need to be aware that even though fireworks are offered for sale nearby, they must not be used in Abbotsford.

There will be road closures due to the Remembrance Day Parade:

- Cruickshank St. from Simon to George Ferguson Way closed to all motor vehicle traffic from 9:30 am - 11:00 am.
- Simon Ave. will have a single lane closure between Trethewey and Cruickshank, between 10:30 am - 11:00 am. Otherwise Simon Ave is open.
- Trethewey Street from South Fraser Way to George Ferguson Way closed to all motor vehicle traffic 10:30 am - 11:00 am.
- Veterans Way from Trethewey to Thunderbird Memorial Square closed to all motor vehicle traffic 10:30 am - 11:00 am.
- Please note: additional parking off Justice Way.
