UPDATE FROM CITY COUNCIL

On behalf of Abbotsford City Council, I am pleased to share with you some of the City's achievements from 2017 as well as some of the ongoing initiatives that are taking place in 2018.

Guiding all of this work is Council's 2015-2018 Strategic Plan, envisioning Abbotsford as the Hub of the Fraser Valley. Every decision we make – at the Council level and by our staff – is guided by the four cornerstones of this plan: vibrant economy, complete community, fiscal discipline and organizational alignment. We have made significant headway over the last 3½ years, but there is still more to be accomplished beyond what we have done so far. Last year, the City launched Plan200K, a comprehensive planning process that includes 20 different Master Plans, Neighbourhood Plans, Studies and Projects, that will help to guide the City as we grow to a community of 200,000 residents. Many of these plans will soon be complete, leaving us in great shape to approach our future.

It's very exciting for me to see our vision progressing. Part of that excitement is sparked by the fact that our plans are the collaborative work of City staff in consultation with you. Through online surveys, open houses and public events, you are helping to shape these important directions.

Building a Hub is definitely a community effort. As a Council, we thank you, our residents and businesses, for caring about our city and for being willing to share your dreams and ideas for how our community should continue to grow.

Abbotsford City Council is very honoured to serve this diverse and vibrant city on the move. Thank you for giving us the privilege to represent you in one of the best cities in BC!

2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- Received \$28 million in federal, provincial and local funding toward the Vye Road widening and Highway 11 overpass projects which will improve access to the Canada-US border crossing as well as YXX.
- Announced the Salton Road Pedestrian/Cycling Bridge that will improve mobility and safety for pedestrians and cyclists and enhance our active transportation systems
- Launched the Plan200K project initiating the update of 20 Master Plans, Strategies and Studies to align with the City's Official Community Plan.
- The City installed traffic calming projects in three neighbourhoods, new sidewalks in four neighbourhoods, 17 kms of new bike lanes, and improved five bus stops so residents could get where they needed to go safely and efficiency.
- The City kept the roads in top shape by repairing 160 kms of road cracks, swept 8, 203 kms of roads, filled 2, 664 pot holes and spent 5,630 hours clearing snow or sanding/salting the roads this winter to ensure safe travelling conditions.



How your tax dollars pay for City services.

This illustration gives a snapshot of how your money is divided up to support services and amenities across our community.

Dollars are based on 2018 budgeted municipal taxes (city/police/library) for a typical single family residence with a property assessment of \$588,000. (Does not include taxes for schools, hospital and the FVRD.)

Sewer and water charges are billed bi-monthly directly to residents that use these services and are not billed on the annual tax notice.

* Utility user fees includes operations and maintenance, current & future infrastructure replacement and debt servicing.

▲ Waterworks & sanitary sewer based on the 2017 median single family water usage (224 m³).

■ Includes bylaw enforcement, corporate & administrative services.

Taxes are due July 3, 2018.


Canada Post postmarks are not accepted as the due date, so please allow for delivery time for your mailed cheque to arrive. City Hall also has drop boxes which are emptied every day. Cheques only, please!

Note that financial institutions **DO NOT** accept Home Owner Grants.

We issued over 1,500 building permits with a record value of \$480 million, a 92% increase over 2016.


Open air burning ban

eBilling delivers your tax and utility bill right to your email box. Easier for you and better for the trees! Visit abbotsford.ca/mycity to sign up!




Abbotsford Fire Rescue Services attended more than 9,000 fire rescue emergency response incidents in 2017, which is an increase of 49% over 5 years.
