Home Health/Adult Protection

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Home Health

- Supports individuals (19 and older) to remain at home as long as possible through a variety of supports.
- Facilitates access to funded Fraser Health programs such as long term care, assisted living, and hospice.
- Interactions/assessment with/by Home Health professions are cost fee.
- Services such as Home Support, funded long term care, funded assisted living are based on annual income.
 - Adults who receive Guaranteed Income Supplement do not have a fee for Home Support.

Home Health Team

- The types of professions in a Home Health team may vary across regions.
- Generally the following professions are in a team:
 - Community Health Nurse (RN/LPN)
 - Social Work
 - Occupational Therapy
 - Physiotherapy
- Some offices have additional professions such as Dietitians, rehab assistants, and pharmacists.

Adult Protection

- Fraser Health is a designated agency which responds to reports and adult may be experiencing abuse, neglect, or self-neglect and is not able to seek support on their own.
- Different programs have different disciplines who act as designated responders. Social Work is the most common profession that does this work.
