Initial Police Response to Reports of Relationship Violence



- Primary Aggressor Analysis
- > Do RPG exist to arrest?
- Safety planning focus
- Apprehension (Child, Family & Community Service Act)
- Sobriety of parties

Evidence



PHOTOGRAPHS

- Signs of a struggle
- Smashed glass/broken doors, windows, drywall
- Broken cell phones
- Blood
- Alcohol or drugs present at scene (*MCFD)
- Weapons, including knives
- Injuries (Victim & Accused)
- Forensic Nurse Examinations

STRANGULATION



- Strangulation (choking)
- Lethality 18% domestic homicides 22% child homicide
- > 7 to 14 seconds = unconsciousness



➤ Section 267 Criminal Code:

Every person is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than 10 years or is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction who, in committing an assault,

(c) chokes, suffocates or strangles

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SAFETY PLANNING/IPV FOLLOW UP



- Residency
- Temporary placement
- Accused have a key to the home?
- Accused have passwords/access to records?
- Need for victim's vehicle/phone to be swept for GPS?
- > Do her neighbors/friends/family/employer/school know?
- Information for alternate contact person for Victim
- CAD Hazard/Flag Record
- > Will Victim provide:
 - Photo of Accused
 - Accused's active phone # (ping warrant) & when they last had contact with them on this phone #
 - Description of device if harassment or breaches via cell
 - Accused's place of employment
 - What vehicle they are driving
- > 10 Day IPV Follow Up

INFO FOR MCFD (and Crown)



- IMPORTANT: Were children present for the incident?
- Do either party have custody or access to children?
- What schools do they attend?
- What is the custody status of the children?
- If the children have a different parent who lives elsewhere, obtain the information of that other parent.
- Evidence in the home that children attend there?
- Children added to the file as CHILD RISK regardless.
- Ensure MCFD is notified and note the date/time/worker on MCFD text page.
- Give consideration to interim safety plan for children.

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APD Intimate Partner Violence Unit



- APD IPVU consists of: 1 sergeant, 2 detectives, 2 VS workers, and 2 MCFD social workers
- Work collaboratively with: Dedicated Bail Supervisor, 4 K file Prosecutors, 3 K file Legal Assistants
- > IPVU may assume files in first instance if extreme in nature but generally files are reviewed after primary patrol based investigation is complete.
- File reviews generally once a week on Wednesdays.
- ➤ IPVU supports current investigation, victim management, ongoing safety planning, conduct interviews, & liaise with partnering agencies.
- Conduct new investigations if evidence surfaces of other offences and breaches.

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IPVU CASE SELECTION



The Decision to assume a file or not is primarily based on:

- Level of violence (lethality, strangulation)
- High-risk offender, repeat offender, history of offender (with current and previous partners)
- Frequency and Escalation of abuse
- Presence of children as witnesses or victims
- Degree of marginalization of victim
 (i.e. disability, pregnancy, isolation, cultural barriers etc.)
- Drug use, mental illness, suicidal ideation



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
