2023 KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Our 2023 accomplishments, set out under four Guiding Principles in the 2022-2026 Strategic Plan, give a high-level view of what the City was focussed on over the past year

PRINCIPLE 1 Inclusive and Connected Community

- Launched the Activity Search Tool on the City's website, a custom program guide for residents that allows customers to customize their recreation program search to their preferences
- Completed Stage 1 of the Aquatic Services & Facilities Strategy and completed Stage 3 of the Arena Services & Facilities Strategy
- Delivered over 50 "Go Play Outside" recreation and culture events, reaching over 10,000 participants
- Introduced Summer Camp Support Positions to provide additional support to children and increase accessibility to summer camps
- 7,171 active volunteers contributed 92,169 volunteer hours to various programs and events through the City's Volunteer Program. The estimated value of the City

PRINCIPLE 2 Sustainable and Safe City

- Hosted 4 large information and networking events through Abbotsford ACCESS providing valuable information and resources to our service organizations
- Successfully renewed our Federal Reaching Home Designated Community grant funding for an additional 2 years

PRINCIPLE 3 Vibrant and Growing Economy

- Digitized building permitting and inspection services resulting in faster turn-around times for builders and developers
- Completed construction of the Vye Road overpass and Highway 11 expansion project in partnership with the Provincial and Federal governments, improving public safety and enhancing economic competitiveness by connecting people and businesses with international markets
- Started construction of the Marshall Road corridor improvement project, providing a safe and efficient route for alternate modes

PRINCIPLE 4 Organizational Excellence and Integrity

- Bargained a new Collective Agreement between the City and CUPE Local 774
- Continued construction of the Abbotsford Police Department Headquarters Upgrade, a project that will meet the safety needs of the City as it grows to a population of 200,000
- Abbotsford Fire Rescue Services responded to over 14,000 incidents

- Received TD Tree Days Grant of \$13,545
 and over 70 volunteers came out to Fish
 Trap Creek Park to install over 825 trees in
 an area for reforestation
- Over 3,500 residents participated in Community Clean up Day and helped pick litter up around their workplace, school, parks, trails and streets
- Received \$25,000 from New Horizons for Seniors for creating and printing seniors resource guides in Punjabi and English (expected March 2024)
- Completed park and playground renewals including the Dave Kandal picnic shelter enclosure, Delair Park Tennis Courts, Homestead Park playground, Berry Park playground and the Albert Dyck beach/ volleyball courts and parking lot upgrades
- Worked with BC Housing to increase shelter beds and supportive housing for our community
- Adopted the McKee Neighbourhood Plan
- Started construction of the Barrowtown Pump Station Standby Generator project and began work on the Barrowtown Pump Station Resiliency Project

- Started construction of the Montrose Transit Exchange, which will support the future transit network, accommodate increased service levels and improve customer experience
- Abbotsford International Airport welcomed over 1.2 million passengers in 2023
- Completed the terminal expansion at Abbotsford International Airport

- Completed Hogan Park playground renewal with the Rotary Club
- Installed new information map kiosks at each cemetery
- Created the "Connect with the City" card that is handed out to the public for different services available to the public
- Maintained roughly 200km of trails throughout the City to keep them safe and passable
- Implemented a "New Tree Coming Soon" sign initiative with a QR code link to our website for more information
- Hosted a successful Family Night at the Fire Halls as part of Fire Prevention Week with over 1600 residents in attendance
- Completed the Fraser Highway Phase I Improvement Project, improving the safety and efficiency of the corridor
- Submitted a \$1.6 billion Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund (DMAF) application for the Sumas River Watershed Flood Mitigation, and continued to advocate for additional funding to improve flood protection for the community

- Processed more than 75 Special Event permits, with a total economic impact of over \$14M
- Launched the new Abbotsford International Airport website to better serve the growing airport and ensure reliable access to information for residents and visitors
- Continued working with the Province and Sumas First Nation on Fraser River bank stabilization and flood mitigation
- Completed the 5th annual Employee Engagement Survey to gain feedback from our employees toward making the City of Abbotsford a great place to work
- Completed our internal Certificate of Recognition (COR) Safety Audit with a 90% success rating
- Developed an Employee Retention Strategy Framework
- Managed the recruitment process for more than 300 positions
- Delivered GIS based mobile applications for our community including Tree Risk Assessment and Trail Inspections
- Implemented the Automated License Plate Reading system which enhances business patronage by optimizing parking availability in busy areas
