## City invites feedback on draft actions for Climate Resilience Strategy

**ABBOTSFORD – April 15, 2026** – The City of Abbotsford is seeking community feedback on proposed action ideas to address climate risks and reduce greenhouse gas emissions as part of the next stage in developing the City’s new Climate Resilience Strategy.

Through a hazard, risk and vulnerability assessment, nine climate hazards and seven non-climate hazards (like earthquakes and social disturbances) were identified for Abbotsford, with flooding, wildfire and extreme heat recognized as the most extreme risks facing the community heading into 2050. Based on these findings and community input received during Round 1 engagement earlier this year, the City has developed several proposed “big moves” to guide future action, strengthen resilience and to protect people, places and critical systems.

Community members are now invited to participate in a follow-up survey to provide feedback on the draft vision, “big moves” and associated action ideas. This input will help refine priorities and ensure the Strategy reflects community needs and perspectives.

The survey is open until May 7. Feedback from the community, along with ongoing technical studies and mapping, will help shape the draft Climate Resilience Strategy.
