Notice of Public Hearing to consider an amendment to Abbotsford Zoning Bylaw, 2014



ABBOTSFORD ZONING AMENDMENT BYLAW BYLAW NO. 3023-2020



SUBJECT LAND: 2549 Montvue Avenue

PURPOSE: If Bylaw No. 3023-2020 is adopted, the text of the Zoning Bylaw would be amended to permit

a Floor Space Ratio of 2.3 to accommodate a three storey, eight unit apartment building with commercial uses on the ground floor.
